COVID-19 & OTHER ELECTION HURDLES

BALLOTS AND ENVELOPES

- Paper shortages
- Over 5,000 ballot styles in August

EXISTING POLLING LOCATIONS

- O Non-responsive
- O Not available
- Too small for physical distancing

POLL WORKERS

- O Prior election experience is required & needed
- O Traditional Model: 3,600 vs. Revised Model: 1,000
- O Physical Distancing Training Considerations
- O PW Correspondence: "Will only work if voting locations are safe"

PERSONAL SAFETY AND CLEANING SUPPLIES

- We needed masks, gloves, disinfecting wipes, hand sanitizer
- O Products were in short supply

- Allow voters to choose how they wanted to participate
- o Provide a historically accessible election
- o Provide voters with information they needed to successfully participate
- Build trust in the election process by providing voters with an accountable, transparent, secure, and reliable election
- Use March and August lessons learned to prepare for the November General Election

2020: 790 Counted 2018: 12,965 | 10,787 Counted


More voters participated in the 2020 August Primary than ever before





Increased Access to Vote by Mail

- ✓ Sent mailers to non-PEVL Voters
- ✓ Made early ballot requests easier
 - One-time or permanently
 - Request.Maricopa.Vote / Solicitud.Maricopa.Voto
 - Online Requests
- ✓ Sent robocall reminders to return ballots





Vote by Mail Outcomes

PEVL Increases

- ✓291,781 New Signups in past year
- ✓ 18% Increase
- √ 76.8% of Active voters are on PEVL
 - 80% Republicans
 - 84% Democrats
 - 66% Independents
 - 73% Libertarians






Military and Overseas Voters Served by Early Voting



[Image: Accessible Voting Device]




[Image: Braille Ballot]



[Image: Large Print Ballot]


Increased Access to Vote In-Person

- O More Early Voting Centers
 - Phased openings (27, 14, 7, 1 day)
 - Included Weekends and Evenings
- "Vote Anywhere" Vote Centers
- O Retail Facilities and Malls
- Located along light-rail / bus routes / Freeways
- Located in high density areas including locations that serve Native American & rural communities



Voted in person today. Safest thing I have done since this whole virus thing began. Workers wearing gloves and masks and face shields. Everything was wiped down the minute someone was done with it...Very safe to vote in person.

STRATEGIES TO IMPROVE ACCOUNTABILITY

Reliability. Security. Integrity.



Reliability

- O Ensured sufficient paper for early ballot requests
- O +100K Early Ballot Drop Offs at Vote Centers / Drop Boxes
- Vote Centers increased access
- O Leased retail spaces, convention centers, mall store fronts
- O Recruited sufficient poll workers to staff polling locations
- Stress Tested (BOD Printers, Tabulators)

Security

- O Partnerships with ACTIC / MCSO / FBI / Homeland Security
- O Tabulation Center on hardwired isolated network / 24 −7 Live camera feed / Restricted access

Integrity

- New Tabulation Equipment (EAC & SOS Certified)
- O Political party observers in tabulation & vote centers
- O 100% Accurate Hand Count Audit









STRATEGIES TO IMPROVE TABULATION

- Electronic Adjudication
 - Over Votes, Smudges (12,395)
 - 20 Boards ½ a Day (New Electronic Adj.)
 - 75 Boards 2 Days (Old Duplication Process)
 - Write-ins (65, 265 Ballots)
 - 20 Boards 3 Days (New Electronic Adj.)
 - 75 Boards 10 Days (Old Duplication Process)
- Counts votes faster
 - 3,000 (Old) vs 6,000 8,000 (New)
 - On Election Night we released over 97% of early ballots that were received by Sunday Night
 - With exception of provisional ballots and need packets, we completed counting on Friday (8/7/2002) by 5pm


- o Advertising 3-phased paid media campaign in both English and Spanish
- o **News Media** Communications staff working with local media to inform the public about voting options in both English and Spanish
- o Direct Outreach By mail, email and phone in both English and Spanish
 - 90 Day Notice
 - Post Card to non PEVL Voters
 - Sample ballot
 - Robocalls to Early Ballot Recipients
 - Direct Emails to Voters

WAIT TIMES

August 2020 Primary Election

WAIT-TIMES BY PHASE

- Early/Emergency Voting: 0 Minutes on Average 12,000 voters
- O 6AM 8AM: 0 Minutes on Average 4,300 Voters
- 8AM 4PM: **Less than 3** Minutes on Average 29,000 Voters
- 4PM 7PM: Less than 1 Minute on Average 19,100 Voters

WINS

- Reported on Website: Locations.Maricopa.Vote
- O Frequent Reporting: Every 15 Minutes
- Compliance Rate: 83.3% Compliance Rate


AREAS FOR IMPROVMENT

O Surprise City Hall: Over 40 Minutes at 4pm





CONTINUOUS IMPROVEMENT

For the November 2020 General Election



- O In-Person Voting
 - Refining Turnout forecasts and evaluating in-person voting patterns from August (1st all vote center model)
 - Phased opening (Locations / Setups / Poll Workers)
- O PPE Guidance
- Wait-Time Reporting
- O Poll Worker / Troubleshooter Training
 - More hands on with Precinct Based Tabulators & Ballot on Demand Printers
 - Streamlined Election Night closing process
- Opportunities to implement curbside voting
